For comparison, the current average mix of resources supplying the United States includes: Coal (30.1%), Nuclear (20%), Oil (<1%), Natural Gas (31.7%), Hydroelectric (7.5%), and Other Fossil (<1%) and Renewables (17.1%; Hydropower: 1.5%, Wind 6.3%, Biomass 1.6%, Solar 1.3% and Other <1%).
